



# FARM PRICES STATISTICS ON SELECTED CROP COMMODITIES, 2017-2018

## Average Farm Prices of Cassava, Fresh, For Consumption


The average farmgate prices of cassava from January to December in 2018 were mostly lower compared to January to December in 2017. The highest price decrement was recorded in March. In 2017 its price was recorded at ₱5.00 per kilogram and it moved down to ₱4.70 per kilogram in 2018. On the other hand, a price increment from ₱4.96 per kilogram in 2017 to ₱5.95 per kilogram in 2018 was noted in the month of September. (See figure 1.)





## Average Farm Prices of Banana, Latundan, Green


Comparing the average farm prices of banana, latundan, green in 2018 and 2017, it moved in different ways. In April, September and October of 2018, its prices moved up compared to the same months in 2017. On the contrary, its prices moved down in the rest of the months, comparing again between 2018 and 2017. Prices in June marked the highest decrement in prices with a price difference of P2.58. In 2017, its average price was P23.68 per kilogram and it went down to P21.10 per kilogram in 2018. (See figure 2.)



## Average Farm Prices of Banana, Saba, Green


The average farmgate prices of banana, green, saba were low in 2018 compared to its prices in 2017. The highest price decrement was noted in February with a price decrease of 23.58 percent or from ₱15.99 per kilogram in 2017 to ₱12.22 per kilogram in 2018. A slight increase however, was recorded in October with a price increase of 0.41 percent. (See figure 3.)





### **Average Farm Prices of Copra, Corriente**

The average farmgate prices of copra, corriente were evidently low in 2018 compared to its prices in 2017. Its prices moved down by 24.16 percent in January 2018 compared to January 2017. From its price of ₱35.02 per kilogram in 2017, it moved down to ₱26.56 per kilogram in 2018 and continued to move down as low as ₱11.72 per kilogram in November 2018 from ₱29.79 per kilogram in November 2017. #### **TECHNICAL NOTES**

Prices received by farmers for crops, livestock and poultry are the farmers' selling prices for their produce at the first point of sale. These prices depend on the place of sale which may be within the production site, at the wholesale market or other areas. At each point of sale, every respondent will be asked the volume sold and freight cost in marketing their product. If a farmer marketed several times during the reference period, the latest quantity sold and prices obtained are reported. Commodities monitored by province are pre-determined based on four (4) criteria, namely:

- 1. major produce of the province in terms of volume of production
- 2. priority crop of the province
- 3. national commodity and the province is one of the major producers
- Producers' Price Index (PPI) commodity Determination of the agricultural commodities to be monitored for farm prices shall be done at the Provincial Statistical Office (PSO).

#### **RATIONALE**

The availability of marketing information in the farm prices is an essential factor not only in the formulation of economic programs and policies but also in the production process of agricultural commodities. This most benefits, among others, the farmers in the stage of production planning and decision-making with regard to optimizing their profit.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

The general purpose of the Farm Prices Survey (FPS) is to gather reliable price information at the farm level. The specific objectives are:

- 1) to generate estimates on farmgate prices of major agricultural commodities;
- to develop sets of price indices and to measure the purchasing power of growers of selected agricultural products;
- 3) to analyze the seasonal trends and variations in agricultural prices;
- to serve as input for forecasting future supply, demand and prices of agricultural commodities;
- 5) to assist policy makers in the formulation, implementation and administration of economic programs; and
- to guide farmers/raisers in their decision making relative to their agricultural activities geared towards improvement of their profitability.

#### FREQUENCY OF DATA COLLECTION

Collection of data is done monthly, during the last 10 days of the month. The reference period is days 1 to 30 of the reporting month.





#### NOTE:

Not all Farm Prices commodities monitored in the province have data series due to on and off trading.
