





GOAT SITUATION REPORT in Central Visayas July-September 2022 Preliminary Result

Date of Release: 02 February 2023 Reference No.: 2023-SR07-008

The total goat production of Central Visayas from July to September 2022 was estimated at 2.49 thousand metric tons, liveweight. This was 13.6 percent higher than the previous year's same quarter production of 2.19 thousand metric tons, liveweight. (Figure 1 and Table 1)


Among all regions, Central Visayas was the top producer of goat during the quarter followed by Ilocos Region with 2.27 thousand metric tons, liveweight and Northern Mindanao with 1.98 thousand metric tons, liveweight. Meanwhile, Eastern Visayas accounted with the lowest goat production at 0.10 thousand metric tons, liveweight. (Figure 1 and Table 1)

In terms of production, the region's percent share was the biggest among all regions at 14.0 percent to the country's total goat production. Among the major producing regions were llocos Region, Northern Mindanao, and BARMM with 12.8 percent share, 11.2 percent share and 10.3 percent share, respectively. These regions including Central Visayas constituted 48.3 percent share of the country's total goat production. (Figure 3 and Table 1)

On other hand, the bottom four regions were Cagayan Valley, CAR, Caraga and Eastern Visayas with 1.9 percent share, 1.3 percent share, 0.7 percent share and 0.6 percent share, respectively. (Figure 3 and Table 1)

Relative to their levels in the same quarter of 2021, nine regions posted reductions in their output during the quarter. In terms of level, llocos Region registered the highest decline of 0.24 thousand metric tons, liveweight from 2.51 thousand metric tons, liveweight in the same quarter of the previous year to 2.27 thousand metric tons, liveweight this third quarter of 2021. 

As of 30 September 2022, Central Visayas total goat inventory was estimated at 592,884 heads. The region contributed highest inventory accounted 15.1 percent share of the country's total goat inventory. This was followed by Western Visayas, and Ilocos Region with respective shares of 12.6 percent, and 10.7 percent. These three regions comprised 38.4 percent share of the country's total goat population. (Figure 4 and Table 2)



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EXPLANATORY NOTES

This Goat Situation Report presents the goat industry in terms of volume of production, inventory by region, and average farmgate prices. The report is prepared to serve as a ready reference for the various clients and stakeholders in the agriculture sector of the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA). It is released quarterly, that is, every February, May, August, and November.

Concepts and Definitions

Volume of production refers to the number of tended/raised goat disposed for slaughter including animals shipped-out for slaughter. This is expressed in metric tons, liveweight.

Inventory refers to the actual number of goat present in the farm as of a specific reference date. The following are the new farm classifications and definitions based on the approved <u>PSA Board Resolution No. 04</u>, series of 2022:

Classification	Definition*
Smallhold	Tending not more than 35 does
Semi-commercial	Tending 36-100 does
Commercial	Tending more than 100 heads of does

*Based on Animal Unit index.

Farmgate price refers to the price received by raisers for their produce at the location of farm. Thus, marketing costs, such as the transport and other marketing costs (if any) incurred in selling the produce, are not included in the farmgate prices. The 2020 to 2021 farmgate prices included in this special release were sourced from Price Statistics Division (PSD), while the 2022 farmgate prices were based on the surveys of Livestock and Poultry Statistics Division (LPSD).
