

BREAKING *the* SILENCE

CENTRAL VISAYAS

END VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

The NDHS 2017 included a Women's Safety Module designed to collect information on domestic violence. Only one eligible women per household was selected to receive this module. In households with more than one eligible women, one respondent was randomly selected. The module can be administered only if complete privacy can be obtained; among the women eligible, less than 1% could not be interviewed because privacy could not be attained.

EVER-MARRIED WOMEN'S EXPERIENCE OF SPOUSAL VIOLENCE (emotional, physical or sexual)



Spousal violence in 2017 increased by 7% from 2013
