



VITAL STATISTICS

January to March 2019

The PSA maintains an archive of Civil Registration documents. The information presented includes registered vital events which occurred from January to March 2019 in Negros Oriental. Several basic forms are needed to record vital events from which vital statistics were generated. These are: • Marriage Certificate – Municipal Form No. 101 • Certificate of Live Birth – Municipal Form No. 102 • Certificate of Death – Municipal Form No. 103 • Certificate of Fetal Death – Municipal Form No. 103A.

REGISTERED BIRTHS

Live Birth is a complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of conception, irrespective of the duration of the pregnancy, which after such separation, breathes or shows any other evidence of life, such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite movement of voluntary muscles, whether or not the umbilical cord has been cut or the placenta is attached; each product of such a birth is considered liveborn.

The total number of registered live births in Negros Oriental by usual residence of mother for the first quarter of 2019 recorded 4,794 of which 2,433 (50.75 percent) were male and 2,361 (49.25 percent) were female.

REGISTERED MARRIAGES

Marriage is a special contract of permanent union between a man and a woman entered into in accordance with law for the establishment of conjugal and family life.

There are 2,210 registered marriages for January to March 2019 in the province. Dumaguete City has the most number of registered marriages of 220. This is 9.95 percent of the total marriages in Negros Oriental for the period.

REGISTERED DEATHS

Death refers to the permanent disappearance of all evidence of life at any time after live birth has taken place (postnatal cessation of vital function without capability of resuscitation).

Fetal Death refers to death prior to the complete expulsion or extraction of a product of conception from its mother, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy. The death is indicated by the fact that after such separation, the fetus does not breathe or show any other evidence of life, such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, and definite movement of voluntary muscles.

There were 2,430 registered deaths in Negros Oriental for the period of which 1,381 (56.83 percent) were male and 1,049 (43.17 percent) were female. Dumaguete City has the most registered deaths with 280 while Jimalalud has the least registered deaths with 39.
