Republic Act 8425 of 1997 (Social Reform & Poverty Alleviation Act)

defines POOR as "individuals and families whose income fall below the poverty threshold as defined by the NEDA and/or cannot afford in a sustained manner to provide their minimum basic needs of food, health, education, housing and other essential amenities of life" (Section 3 of the RA 8425)

POVERTY THRESHOLD

is the minimum income required for a family or individual to meet the basic food and non-food requirements, also known as the **POVERTY LINE**.



A Siquijodnon needed at least

Php 2,135

on average monthly to meet his/her basic food and non-food needs in 2018.

This will also be used to monitor **SDG 1: No Poverty**. Indicator 1.2.1: Proportion of population living below the national poverty line.

POVERTY INCIDENCE

is the proportion of families or individuals with per capita income less than the per capita Poverty Threshold to the total number of families or individuals.

POVERTY INCIDENCE AMONG FAMILIES (%)



FOOD THRESHOLD

is the minimum income required for a family or individual to meet the basic food needs, which satisfies the nutritional requirements for economically necessary and socially desirable physical activities

AMONG POPULATION



In 2018, a Siquijodnon needed at least

PhP 1,491

on average monthly to meet their basic food needs.
