Consumer Price Index and Inflation Rate for All Income Households by Commodity Group (2018 = 100)



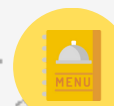

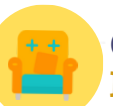

Consumer Price Index (CPI)

an indicator of the change in the average retail prices of a fixed basket of goods and services commonly purchased by households relative to a base year

Inflation Rate (IR)

annual rate of change or the year-on-year change of the CPI expressed in percent

Purchasing Power of Peso (PPP)

shows how much the peso in the base period is worth in the current period

- Starting 2022, the base year for the CPI was rebased to 2018.
- For the rebased series, two new commodity groups were added, namely, (XII) Financial Services, and (XIII) Personal Care, and Miscellaneous Goods and Services
