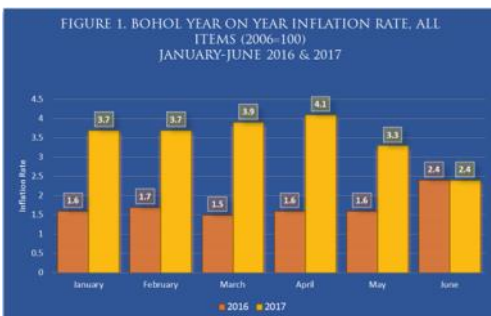

## Inflation Rate highest in April, declines afterwards

Every month, the PSA gathers retail prices of commodities for the generation of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) is generated monthly through collection of price. CPI is an indication of the change in the average retail price of a fixed basket of goods and services commonly purchased by a household relative to a base year. In this case, the base year used is 2006. For the province of Bohol, there are five(5) sample outlets for this activity.

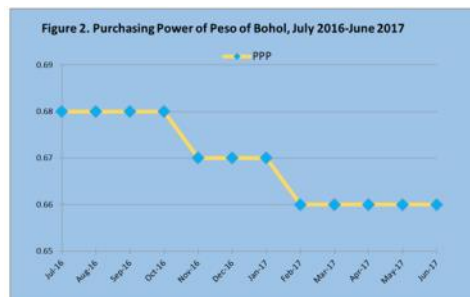
For the first six months of 2017, the CPI of Bohol is increasing from 150.2 in January to 151.9 in June.

As shown in Figure 1, inflation rate peaked in April at 4.1 percent, 0.4 higher than that of January and 1.7 higher than the lowest value that is recorded in June. Inflation rate is the annual rate of change of the CPI ex-

Moreover, prices were accelerating at a faster rate this year compared to last year. The inflation rates of the same period of last year ranged only from 1.5 to 2.4. The largest year-on-year difference was recorded at 2.5 points that is in the month of April.

The same graph shows that prices increase at a slower rate in May. The trend even went lower to 2.4 on the following month.

Figure 2 shows the Purchasing Power of the Peso (PPP) of the Boholanos for July 2016 to June 2017. PPP shows how much the peso in the base period is worth in the current period. It is inversely proportional to the inflation rate. For Boholanos, the PPP is 66 cents in June this year. This means that, the Php100.00 of a Boholano could buy 100 pieces of bread in 2006. But now, the same amount could buy only 66 pieces.

## PSA GEOTAGS BUILDING STRUCTURES

Starting last May, the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) conducted the 2017 Tablet-Aided Geotagging of Building Structures, the second phase of the five-year Rolling Scheme Field Updating of Digitized Census Maps and Validation of SSUs.

### What is Geotagging?

As defined, geotagging is the process of marking all building structures as points in the digitized maps. Geographical information is attributed to these points including building address, name, type, form, among others. This undertaking aims to create dynamic digitized maps for use in different censuses and surveys of the PSA.

### And the ball started rolling....

For the province of Bohol, six (6) Map Data Collectors (MDCs) and one Map Data Screener (MDS) were hired for this activity. They attended the 3<sup>rd</sup> Level Training on April 24-28, 2017 at PSA Bohol Provincial Office with the provincial focal person, RO I Venus P. Gloria, as the trainer. This involves a total of 192 Primary Sampling Units (PSU) province-wide.

On May 8, 2017, with motivated hearts, the MDCs began their fieldwork in Tagbilaran City, the capital of Bohol. But before going to the field, the MDCs had their courtesy call to the office of the Mayor then to the Punong Barangay.

Then the fieldwork began. "It is one of the most challenging activities of PSA." says one MDC. Yes, it truly is. Why? It is not a team-approach operation like the previous mapping operations. Another reason is that all buildings inside the PSU will be geotagged, regardless of its type. Also, some respondents were apprehensive due to the recent peace and order problem of the province.

The expected date of completion is August 31. However, as of this writing, only 155 PSUs, that is, 80.7%, were completed. ■

## 5S: A jumpstart towards ISO Certification

To promote a healthier working environment and in preparation for the ISO 9001 Quality Management System Accreditation, a Re-echo on 5S Orientation was conducted in PSA Bohol Provincial Statistical Office last May 22, 2017 by AO1 Mirafior O. Payot and RO1 Gaudiosa C. Oculares.

## Attendance to CSC's Values Orientation Workshop (VOW)

With the goal to deliver quality services to its clientele through motivated and committed employees, two of PSA Bohol's Administrative Officers, namely, Xina Ixora O. Aranas and Mirafior O. Payot attended a two-day Values Orientation Workshop conducted by the Civil Service Commission on April 6-7, 2017 at the Civil Service Commission Regional Office, Sudlon, Lahug, Cebu City.

The workshop was participated by forty (40) employees from different government agencies namely LGU Trinidad, LGU Loon, LGU Bais City, NFA Region 7 Provinces, DPWH Negros Occidental and PSA Bohol.

The objectives of the workshop are to clarify one's long existing values, to express commitment to chosen values and to formulate an action plan

which would support the commitment made.

The workshop consisted of five (5) modules: personhood (pagkatao), being a Filipino citizen (pagka-Filipino), consciousness of the environment (pagka-kalikasan), being a civil servant (pagka-tagpaglingkod) and integration.

Pursuant to Republic Act No. 6713 otherwise known as the "Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards for Public Officials and Employees" and Republic Act No. 9485 also known as Anti-Red Tape Act of 2007", VOW is adopted as a continuing intervention program by the CSC designed to implant appropriate norms and conduct becoming of government employees. ▣



Ubi, yes that is what it's commonly called or yam if you'd prefer it in English. "*Dioscorea Alata*" is the scientific name given to this species of perennial herbaceous vines. Grown throughout the country this crop comes in two colors – white and purple. According to wiki it is known to have different varieties; the kabus-ok, iniling, tamisan, balingonhon, binanag, binugas/gimnay and binato. Of course you may have known or tasted one or two of these varieties, but none of them could quite compare to the aroma and the sweetness of the one that grows only in our province of Bohol. This rare variety is scientifically called "*Dioscorea alata* Linn" and yes it is purple and we call it the Kinampay. Some say that its sweetness comes from the Boholano soil where it is planted and the diligence and commitment of the farmer who nurtures it.

The Kinampay, and I mean the Kinampay is revered in our province. It is in fact the symbol of our beloved Bohol. If one is to listen intently to the Bohol Hymn or "Awit sa Bohol" the last word of the first paragraph of the hymn is the word Kinampay.

To the Bol-anon it is regarded as the god of all root crops and there are specific rules on how to handle this particular crop. The reason I know about these is that my great grandmother specifically instructed these rules to my Lola and Lola taught them to me. Each one must be stored properly and the part where the buds are must always be on top. When moving the crop, one has to be extra careful and must hold each Kinampay with both hands and place it in a spot where it cannot fall down. If by some reason one falls to the ground you have to kiss it so that it will not lose its sweet taste or worst it could rot.

If you happen to be in our province please be advised that you can savor the sweetness of the Kinampay as it is sold in grocery stores as Ubi Jam.

So there you are the one and the only Kinampay and let it be known that from this day onwards the newsletter of the Bohol Provincial Statistical Office will be named **The Kinampay Mirror**.

## ICS – Basic Training Course in Cebu City

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), as part of the multi-agency that will represent in the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council, Region VII, spearheaded by the Office of Civil Defense, has participated in the Incident Command System Basic Training Course last May 24-26, 2017 at Azia Suite and Residences in Cebu City.

At a glance, Incident Command System is an On-Scene Disaster Response and Management Mechanism under the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management System (PDRRMS) ergo - it is a management tool that is proven to be an effective disaster response mechanism at the scene level and has been emanated and utilized by the United States and adopted by a number of other countries. Further, it is now rapidly emerging as the common management tool and an international language for disaster response.

Once more, the office thru the Regional Statistical Service Office, Region 07 (RSSO) and Bohol Provincial Statistical Office (BPSO) both valiantly handpicked and dispatched magnanimously its representatives to the said Basic Training Course and the ensuing training courses – if the situation calls for their representations later – to fulfil the mandate given by the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) by virtue of its Memorandum Circular No.4 Series of 2012, dated 28 March 2012.

Felixberto M. Sato Jr. of RSSO Region 7 and Fidel R. Antopina Jr. of Bohol joined the multi-agency participants on ICS Basic Training Course at said venue lectured by four (4) National Cadres headed by Dr. Joseph Al L. Alesna, a pediatric surgeon by profession. The training was encapsulated to eight (8) modules, namely; Introduction to ICS, Organization and Staffing, ICS Facilities, Organizing and Managing Incidents and Events, Incident / Event Assessment and Management by Objectives, Incident Resources and Resource Management, Incident and Event Planning and lastly Transfer of Command, Demobilization and Closeout.

As aptly stated in MC No.04 of 2012 and as a general background to this incident management tool, it was being observed that natural and human-induced disasters are becoming more frequent and climate change has further added to the unpredictability of their occurrences as well as their impact on society. It is in this context that our government, through the NDRRMC, is confronted with the challenge to level up its awareness and vigilance in ensuring that disaster risks are prevented and minimized accordingly and thus prepared to meet the needs of affected population when disasters or emergencies occur.

The three-day training was impeccably graced by Dir. Concepcion Ornopia, MNSA, the Regional Director of the Office of Civil Defense, Region VII. It was facilitated, cooperated and assisted by their arrays of staffs who were all experts in planned and unplanned events using the ICS ways. ■

## PSA Bohol participates in Mobile Services

With the aim of bringing public service closer to the people, the Bohol Provincial Statistical Office actively and consistently participated in the Mobile Services of National Agencies on May 19, 2017 at Bohol Cultural Center, Tagbilaran City. Other agencies include Professional Regulation Commission (PRC), Philippine Postal Corporation and Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB). It was initiated by the Provincial Government of Bohol, through Bohol Employment and Placement Office (BEPO).

During the first semester of 2017, a total of 1,448 beneficiaries have been served and

## April 2017 Labor Force Survey

To monitor the changes in the employment status of persons in the working age population during a specified time period, thus a quarterly labor force survey is conducted.

The training for the April 2017 round of the LFS was conducted on April 6 – 7, 2017 at

the conference room of PSA Bohol Provincial Office in preparation for the quarterly labor force survey. It was participated by five (5) hired Statistical Researchers who will cover the 27 EAs with 384 households province-wide.

The April 2017 LFS is the second round where the use of the Computer Aided Personal Interviewing (CAPI) using tablet was implemented.

The LFS, a quarterly household survey, aims to provide a quantitative framework for the preparation of plans and formulation of policies affecting the

labor market.

Specifically, the survey is designed to provide statistics on levels and trends of employment, unemployment and underemployment for the country, as a whole, and for each of the administrative regions, including provinces and key cities.

Enumeration and data collection started on April 8 up to April 30, 2017, the time where the province was threatened with the presence of the abu sayyaf where gun battle took place between the military near the sample areas of the LFS. ■

This activity was spearheaded by Ms. Celestina Pentacase, the ever active Municipal Civil Registrar of Talibon, Bohol.



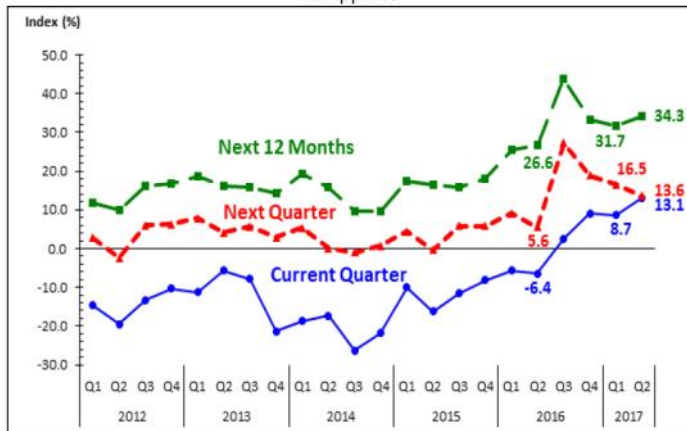

## April 2017 Consumer Expectations Survey

A total of forty eight (48) out of forty eight (48) sample households drawn out from the Secondary Sample List in the entire province of Bohol were successfully interviewed or a significant one hundred percent (100%) mark.

This is a result of the 2017 April Consumer Expectations Survey conducted by Philippine Statistics Authority, Bohol Provincial Statistical Office last April 1-12, 2017 interviewed by old time Statistical Researcher Charles Concepcion S. Pangilinan in our three (3) sample barangays Botoc Oriental, Loay, Balili, Jagna and Aguipo, Mabini.

Provincial Statistics Officer Jessamyn Anne C. Alcazaren stressed the importance of the survey since this is an economic survey that needed by the Bangko Sentral Ng Pilipinas (BSP) which is the primary stakeholder of the data released quarterly in every year since its inception last 2008. Hence, this is a joint undertaking by BSP and PSA nationwide.

This is a household-based survey on the consumer's assessment of their family income, financial situation and the economic condition of the country. To note further, this is also a complementary survey to the Bangko Sentral Ng Pilipinas (BSP) Business Expectations Survey (BES).

Among the objectives of the survey are to provide a quick and regular assessment of the financial condition of consumers and economic condition of the country at present and in the near future, the consumer's confidence in terms of their income and expenditures as well as their outlook on key economic indicators closely monitored by the BSP such as inflation, exchange rates and interest rates.

BSP therefore awaits this overwhelming economic data generated quarterly by PSA such as CES for their analysis and implementation of policies by our financial managers both privately and publicly. ■

## Livestock and Poultry Industry Performs High Despite Calamities



Despite the calamities experienced in 2016, livestock industry in the province sustained its performance as it managed an increase in production for all animal types. Goat registered a production of 795 metric tons, which is up by 10.42 percent over that in 2015. Similarly, carabao, cattle and hog also indicated an increment of about 6.68 percent, 0.73 percent and 6.70 percent, respectively. Reported production of carabao is up to 2,954 metric tons, cattle of 6,245 metric tons

and hogs of about 46,689 metric tons. Increased production was due to rise in disposition which was attributed to less available forage resulting from the intense heat in the first semester.

On the other hand, expansion of some commercial farms influenced the 3.64 percent growth in chicken production from 25,304 metric tons in 2015 to 26,226 metric tons in 2016. However, a slight decline of 2.16 percent in chicken egg at 5,804 metric tons from 5,932 metric tons was due to some culling of less

productive flock and lower Egg Laying Efficiency Ratio(ELER) of replacement flock. The same was for duck egg, wherein production decreased by 21.43 percent i.e. from 28 metric tons in 2015 to 22 metric tons in 2016. ■
