Operational Training on Quarterly Fisheries Survey

The 2nd Level Training on Quarterly Fisheries Survey (QFS) was conducted on August 8-9, 2018 at the Regional Statistical Services 7 (RSSO7). There were ten participants attending; two personnel from PSA Bohol in the persons of SA Nicefora L. Marimon and AA VI Kevin O. Marasigan and other PSA personnel from RSSO7 and from the provinces of Cebu, Siquijor and Negros Oriental.



The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) through the Fisheries Statistics Division (FSD) under the Economic Sector Statistics (ESSS) is responsible for the conduct of periodic surveys related to fisheries. The fisheries sector is composed of three (3) subsectors, namely, commercial, municipal fisheries and aquaculture. There are four (4) quarterly surveys that generate volume and value of production by species at the national, regional and provincial level. The data sets are also used for policy making and program implementation on fisheries.

Discussions were tackled on the survey methodology, field operations, survey forms, data review and validation, preparation of narrative reports and dissemination. Meanwhile, by 2019, new survey forms will be used by PSA nationwide.

The 2-day training was facilitated by SA Juliet D. Lumboan from RSSO7 and SS II Vernito M. Minguito from PSA Cebu who also attended the 1st Level Training (Taskforce) in Manila. It was a very informative training especially to those who were first timers in fisheries activities.

Engr. Ariel E. Florendo, the Regional Director of RSSO7 and SOCD-Chief Engr. Leopoldo P. Alfanta Jr. gave their heartfelt messages and encouraged the participants to come up with innovations during the training. One of the innovations was to familiarize with fish species thru pictures. PSA Bohol fisheries focal person, Nicefora L. Marimon shared her collection of pictures of fish species with corresponding English and Visayan terms. It was compiled by RSSO7 in a manual form and after one month it was distributed to PSA provincial offices. ▀

Bohol Fish Production Registers 15.94 Percent Growth in the Third Quarter of 2018

For the third quarter of 2018, the province of Bohol registered fisheries production of 10,221.87 metric tons which posted an increment of 15.94 percent from 8,816.54 metric tons of the same quarter of 2017. Compared to 3rd quarter of 2016, it registered a remarkable decline in production by 55.17. This was revealed by the result of the September Quarterly Fisheries Survey (QFS).

Among the Fisheries subsectors covered by QFS, Aquaculture subsector registered the biggest contribution to the total fisheries production of 64.00 percent. In terms of volume it increased by 876.84 metric tons compared to the same quarter of last year. Of all the aquaculture farm types, Seaweed contributed 86.21 percent

of the total aquaculture production.

Commercial fisheries subsector registered a decrement of 16.06 percent. From a production of 269.10 metric tons same quarter last year, it declined to 225.89 metric tons on the 3rd quarter of 2018. Of the major species, Roundscad, Big-eyed Scad and Bullet Tuna outputs displayed downtrend in production. The production of Commercial Fisheries is composed of the combined catch in traditional and LGU-managed landing centers. During the period, LGU-managed landing centers posted negative output.

Municipal fisheries, both marine and inland, registered production increases of 19.67 and 57.32 percent, respectively. Total Marine Municipal fisheries posted an increase in production of 19.85 percent compared to the same quarter of 2017. ▀

Mobile Services: Avenue for Closer Public Service

One-Stop-Shops are regularly organized by LGUs as part of their regular activities for the public. During these activities, PSA Bohol is always invited to render services.

From July to September, three of these were attended by PSA Bohol employees.

Foundation Day in Danao

With the aim of bringing public service closer to the people, PSA Bohol actively and consistently participated in the Mobile Services conducted at the Local Government Unit of Danao, Bohol in commemoration of its 57th Foundation Day. It was held at Danao Multi-Purpose Hall on July 7, 2018. This is an annual activity which involves national government agencies.

RO II Glenda Wahing, RO I Felicitas Aranas and AO I Mirafior Payot attended the whole day activity. With the full support of LGU Danao, the office accept

requests for the issuance of security papers (SECPA) request of birth, marriage, death and certificate of no marriage (CENOMAR) with the fee of P155.00 and P210.00, respectively. A total of 645 applications have been served and catered by PSA.

HEAT-IT Caravan in Loon

PSA Bohol actively and consistently participated the HEAT-IT caravan last August 30, 2018 at Loon Public Market-Loon, Bohol. It was participated by National government agencies both public and private sectors. It was initiated by the Provincial Government of Bohol headed by Governor Edgar M. Chatto.

It was attended by RO II Glenda Wahing, RO I Felicitas Aranas, RO I Gaudiosa Oculares and AO I Mirafior Payot. A total of 556 applications have been served and catered by PSA.

Acceptance of requests for SECPA copies of birth, marriage, death and Certificate of No Marriage (CENOMAR).

PSA-BEPO Partnership on the Go

The Provincial Government of Bohol, through the Office of the Governor – Bohol Employment and Placement Office (GO-BEPO) conducted the Mobile Services of National Agencies on 28 September 2018 at the Bohol Cultural Center, Tagbilaran City.

There were three invited agencies to render their services during the day. These were the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB), and Philippine Postal Corp. (PHLPOST). PSA was represented by AO Mirafior Payot, RO Gaudiosa Oculares, SA Venus Gloria, RO Gerardo Binangbang, and RO Federico Aparri.

Applications for SECPA requests (birth/marriage/death and CENOMAR) were catered during the day. A total of 626 applications were received for that day. ■



Seminar for Solemnizing Officers



Registration Officer I Cielito Evangelista and RO I Felicitas Aranas acted as resource speakers during the Seminar for Solemnizing Officers facilitated by the Confederation of Evangelical Ministries Association of Bohol, Inc. (CEMABI) on September 4, 2018 at Graham, Belarmino, Leopando and Tirol Memorial Church, Booy Dist., Tagbilaran City.

RO Evangelista discussed the Marriage laws in the Philippines, and RO Aranas discussed the requirements of CRASM, Instructions on filling up application form of CRASM and grounds for cancellation of CRASM. It was participated by 68 solemnizing officers. ■

Seminar Workshop on Civil Registration with MCR Staff and Partners

PSA Bohol in cooperation with Bol-anong Asosasyon with Civil Registration Officers (BACRO) conducted a two-day Seminar Workshop on Civil Registration with MCR Staff and Partners.

PSO Jessamyn Anne C. Alcazaren served as resource speaker in the said seminar together with Registration Officer IV Hera B. Juarez, Registration Officer II Glenda E. Wahing and MCR Jose Jovencio Orcullo. The event was held at JJ's Seafood Village, K of C Drive, Gallares St., Tagbilaran City on September 27-28, 2018. A total of 106 attendees on the said activity. Participants were hospital medical records officers, MCR staff and barangay secretaries. ■



PSO'S CORNER



Daily Encounters with our Walk-In Clients

Year 2018 for Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Bohol and the entire family is a productive journey, with deliverables on top of the priorities of all workforce. With a mindset for continuous improvement, part of the year-ending realization still includes improving our best efforts, putting foot forward in making our clients delighted and even surprised.

May I share to you some of the daily encounters and the opinions as we exchanged chit-chats with clients. These shall serve as mirror of the office in dealing with these challenges. Top three in the list are as follows and how we managed to answer them with tactfulness and a sense of professionalism:

1. Why PSA Bohol cannot cater walk-in requests for security paper (SECPA)?

Immediate answer from our end is an explanation that in Region VII only PSA Regional Office in Cebu and PSA Dumaguete are serbilis outlets. Nationwide, so far, only about forty-one (41) outlets are operational from among the seventeen (17) regions and eighty-one (81) provinces. In addition, PSA Bohol also offers a list of options where one can avail of the services that include thru on-line services, PSA Helpline plus and twenty-four (24) active BREQS outlets in the province. Further we explain that at times, in collaboration with the Bohol Provincial Office and LGUs the office also receives requests of applications, however these shall be released thirty working days thereafter. With the onset of the Civil Registry System – Information Technology Project II, PSA Bohol may be included in the forty (40) additional outlets, and for sure if it shall be materialized in the next five years Boholanos would be very happy then. They will no longer travel to Cebu or Dumaguete to avail of these services.

2. Why feedback forms still do exist?

A number of our walk-in clients sought assistance on the process of the feedback forms received from Central Office (CO), where these cases involved resubmission or lack of documents submitted. Gracefully, we catered their concerns. First things first, we evaluated the content and have them photocopied as our reference in the follow-up. Coordination too with Local Civil Registry Officer (LCRO) is tapped to facilitate and expedite the processing. Written communications through e-mail are sent to CO/LCRO and copy furnished to the clients. So far these helped our walk-in clients a lot and they are grateful for the help extended by the office. With the new law crafted RA 11032 which was approved last May 28, 2018, Ease of Doing Business (EODB) and in addressing this kind of recurring feedbacks, National Statistician and Civil Registrar General (NSCRG) Lisa Grace S. Bersales issued an Office Memorandum dated October 22, 2018 about the process of endorsements of applications from LCRO to CO specifically on corrections or changes of entry thru RA 9048 and RA 10172. Effective 04 November 2018, the NSCRG will no longer issue a Return to Sender Notifications or popularly known as feedback form. Rather the NSCRG will only affirm or impugn the decision of the Local Civil Registrar (LCR) or Consul General (CG). Therefore, Civil Registrars and Consul Generals must ensure that the petition and its attachments forwarded to Central Office are complete and compliant with the requirements.

Tourism and its Sustainability

With the decline in the amount of travel cost, travellers tend to visit more places more often. *“While tourism as an economic activity contributes to the growth of an economy, it also contributes to irreversible damage to the environment” (IRTS, 2008).* It is true that tourism has its positive impacts to the country. But are we aware of its ill-effects to our natural resources? How do we assess its sustainability? Is the data available at the provincial level? These are just few of the questions that needs to be addressed regarding tourism.

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) through the Macroeconomic Accounts Section (MAS), aims to come up with a comprehensive system to compile tourism-related data and to provide analysis thereof. Training on the Basic Concepts of Tourism Satellite Accounts (TSA) and Measuring Sustainable Tourism (MST) was conducted on 24 to 26 July 2018 at Aziza Paradise Hotel, Puerto Princessa City, Palawan.

Participants include from predetermined provinces that are considered as tourist destinations. For Central Visayas, only Bohol and Cebu were included. The RSSO VII team is composed of RD Ariel E. Florendo, SOCD Chief Leopoldo P. Alfanta Jr., PSO Firmo C. Diputado of Cebu, and RO I Venus P. Gloria of Bohol. Attendees from the tourism sector such as the Department of Tourism and the Provincial Tourism Office were also present. ANS Vivian R. Ilarina, Eduardo B. Sanguyo, and Florande S. Ploiistico of MAS are among the speakers for the three-day training.

The training did not only involve discussions but also workshops and presentation of outputs. Then on the afternoon of the last day, the group enjoyed a tour around the tourist spots of Puerto Princessa City. Of course, a tourism-related training will not be complete without a tour.

It was a comprehensive training indeed. The participants were able to know about the current situation of Philippine tourism. The vision of the office to come up with a provincial-level data on tourism is already attainable. However, achieving this goal would require a lot. This calls for more capacity-building activities and a more systematized and established methodology especially with the demand at hand.

Sustainable Development Goals: Seminar 1

The United Nations (UN) recently developed a new set of goals after the Millennium Development Goals (set in 2000) were completed by 2015. These new set of goals are collectively called the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG). The SDGs were formulated in September 2015 with 17 goals with 169 targets that must be achieved by 2030.

In order to invoke the participation of the public sector in attaining the SDGs, the Philippine Statistical Research and Training Institute (PSRTI) aims to conduct a series of seminars on SDGs. The first of this series of training-workshops was held on 19 July 2018 at Azia Hotel and Suites, Cebu City.

There were around a hundred participants that were composed of officers of Provincial and Municipal Planning and Development Councils, principals of selected schools and employees of PSA of the region of Central Visayas. For Bohol, the participants from PSA were PSO Jessamyn Anne C. Alcazaren, AO I Mirafior O. Payot and RO I Venus P. Gloria.

For the one-day workshop, the topics discussed were SDG overview, data ecosystem, SDG matrix for municipalities, and Basic Statistics. The workshop was graced by the presence of the executive director of PSRTI, Dr. Josefina V. Almeda. After the discussions, the attendees were asked to fill-up the SDG matrix that was submitted upon accomplishing it.

Another set of trainings/workshops in continuation of this Seminar 1 is expected to be conducted in the following months or years. ■

3. How long will it take for a Solemnizing Officer to have his/her Certificate of Registration of Authority to Solemnize Marriage (CRASM) be available from the office?

On a monthly basis, a range of 10 to 15 Solemnizing Officers (SO) submit their application for CRASM. Common issue from them is how long will it take for the SO to receive the authority. Again, with the new law RA 11032, the office makes sure submission of requirements from Provincial to Regional Office are in staggered basis, so that waiting time will be shorter. For review on the completeness of documents, with the initiative of the Regional Office, an improvised transmittal is provided such that both parties, the SO and focal person, shall check each item before submission to Regional Office.

The mantra of “**Working SMARTER through Innovation**” is paving the way for PSA towards its peak of world class performance. Long live PSA Bohol Family! ■
