The month of February was declared as the Civil Registration Month (CRM) by then President Corazon C. Aquino through Presidential Proclamation No. 682. Since its declaration, the CRM was celebrated every year and was being observed in all parts of the country. This year is the 28th and it conveys a theme "Inclusive and Responsive CRVS: Working Smarter Through Innovation". The CRM aims to remind the public of their duty to register acts and events concerning status of persons. It also enhances nationwide awareness and appreciation of the legal, administrative, and statistical values of civil registry documents.

In response to the CRM's objective, the Philippine Statistics Authority held its first ever On-the-Spot Poster Making contest last 28 February 2019 at 2F Galleria Luisa Bldg., Gallares St., Tagbilaran City, Bohol. The contest was open to all junior and senior high school students of all private and public schools in Tagbilaran City. Among the declared winners were Jann Carl Myko A. Dominise and Clayton Dave Aparicio who got the first and the second place respectively while Martin M. Buyan got the third place. The winners were awarded with cash and a certificate while the rest of the contestants were also given certificates. As it was the first so far, participants were very happy that such activity was being initiated. Everybody are even more excited for the next year's celebration. ■

2019 Civil Registration Month

PSA Bohol successfully celebrated this year's Civil Registration Month anchored with the theme "Inclusive and Responsive CRVS: Working Smarter through Innovation". This year's theme emphasize the significance of timely and accurate vital statistics, promote awareness on the importance of civil registration and encourage every Filipinos to register vital events.

For this year, PSA Bohol in collaboration with the Local Civil Registry Offices (LCROs) conducted various activities which includes Mass Weddings, Mobile Registrations, Symposia in schools and display of streamers.

A total of ninety six (112) couples exchange vows in the LGU-sponsored mass weddings in the municipalities of Trinidad, Talibon, Tagbilaran City, Jagna, Carmen and Albuquerque.

A Poster Making and Essay Writing Contest was conducted on February 28, 2019 as part of the culminating activity for the 2019 Civil Registration Month.

Various symposia were held at public and private schools and universities province wide.

A total of 1610 students attended the said activity. This activity was done to raise awareness about civil registry

laws on the correction of entries in the civil registry documents.

Twenty-six (26) Local Government Units (LGUs) showed their support and participation in the celebration by displaying streamers free of charge in the vicinity of their office during the whole month of February 2019.

Fifteen (15) barangays were visited for the mobile registrations conducted particularly in the municipalities of Talibon, Candijay and Mabini. ■

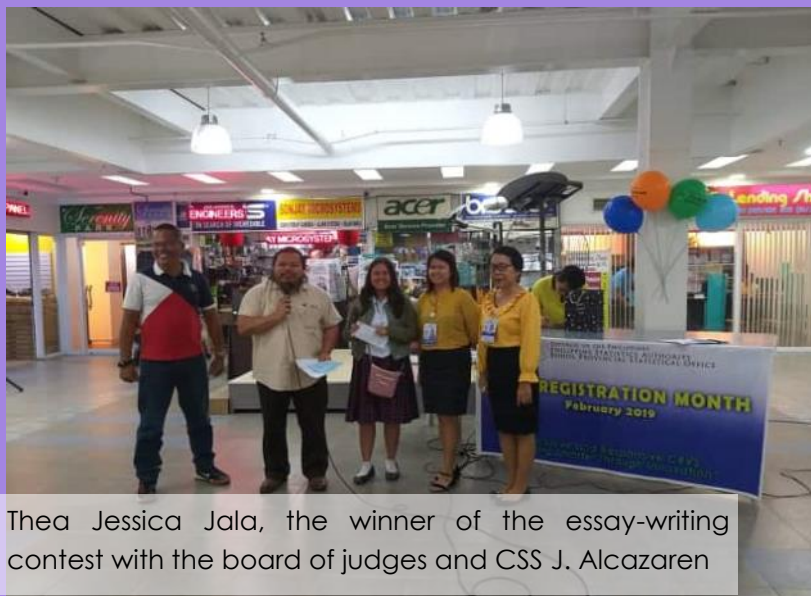

Mass Weddings

It is a common activity for LCROs to organize mass weddings as part of the Civil Registration Month. In fact, some municipalities, make it a yearly undertaking during the said month.

For the first three months of 2019, a total of six LCROs conducted mass weddings. Four of these were held in February and two in March.

In February, Tagbilaran City and the municipalities of Trinidad, Talibon, and Jagna, offered free weddings for couples, whereas, in March, Carmen and Alburquerque.

Different PSA Bohol employees served as witnesses as 122 couples happily tied knots upon being wedded either in the Church or through a civil one. ■

Mobile Registrations

Another activity regularly conducted by LCROs during the Civil Registration Month is the mobile registration in remote barangays within the municipality.

This 2019, PSA Bohol employees assisted in fifteen (15) mobile registrations particularly in Talibon, Jagna, Candijay and Mabini.

Some of the services offered include acceptance of requests for SecPa, late registrations, advise on civil registration document errors, and legitimation. ■

PSA Bohol Provincial Statistical Office has supported once again the one-stop-shop program of the Bohol Provincial Government dubbed as HEAT IT caravan and this time, it was held in Tubigon town last March 14.

It was the last HEAT IT caravan held in the province since Governor Edgar M Chatto started this program. The HEAT IT Bohol caravan was held alternately between the towns of the 1st, 2nd and 3rd districts of the province. As the flagship program of Governor Chatto in his advocacy to reduce poverty in Bohol, HEAT stands for Health and Sanitation, Education and Technology, Agriculture and Food Security, and Tourism and Livelihood. This caravan is committed to reach out to the poorest and most vulnerable sectors by bringing the provincial government's services to the Boholanos. It

gives people direct access to various essential programs and services of the provincial government in partnership with the national agencies and private sector.

A total of one hundred ninety-two(192) clients where being served.

HEAT IT caravan was a signature service program that makes the Boholanos more than feel the presence of the government. ■

January 2019 Labor Force Survey/2018 Family Income and Expenditures Survey - Visit 2

Quarterly surveys are usually conducted on the first month of every quarter. One of these is the Labor Force Survey (LFS). For this round, the rider survey is the 2018 Family Income and Expenditures Survey - Visit 2.

The third level training was conducted at JJ's Seafood Village and Restaurant, K of C Driveway, Poblacion II, Tagbilaran City on 03-08 January 2019. The training was divided into two classes as there were fifty six (56) hired Statistical Researchers and six regular employees of PSA Bohol for the undertaking. SS II Colita E. Montoya served as the Provincial Focal Person.

The enumeration started on 09 January 2019 and lasted until the second week of February because of so many callbacks, one SR met a car

accident and another SR backed out.

Manual editing was done first before the final uploading of the LFS raw data. Random checking of the questionnaires was made and the questionnaires were returned to the SRs due to inconsistencies and failure to be edited.

For the FIES, manual and machine processing of the questionnaires were also done. The manual processing involved ten hired SRs who worked for 30 mandays starting 18 February 2019.

It is the first time that the machine processing was done at the provincial office. The said phase employed seven encoders with AA VI Kevin O. Marasigan as the supervisor. The data encoding and validation was completed on 26 April 2019. ■

PSA Bohol Conducts AWRS

PSA Bohol conducted the Agricultural Wage Rate Survey (AWRS) January 2018 Round for Palay and Corn. Two Statistical Researchers were hired for the survey who also attended the Third Level Training scheduled on 10-11 January 2019 with the AgStat Focal Person SSII Blecila M. Paredes, Cereals point person ROI Gerardo T. Binangbang and AWRS Point person ROI Gaudiosa C. Oculares. The training was conducted at PSA Bohol provincial office.

The enumeration period was on 12-18 January 2019. For January 2018 only hired Statistical Researchers were involved in the survey operation with the regular staff as supervisors. Twenty samples for palay and corn were enumerated.

Editing and machine processing followed after the enumeration and was undertaken in the provincial office by the focal person. Data review and validation report in the provincial level were also done by the provincial personnel prior to submission to the Regional Office.

AWRS is a national survey covering the

producing provinces of palay, corn, coconut and sugarcane. Specifically, for Bohol, it only covers palay, corn and coconut. Palay and corn conducted every semester and coconut conducted annually. Palay and corn uses the Palay and Corn Production Survey (PCPS) sampling frame while for coconut the list of samples was generated in the province based on available data and interview of key informants. AWRS aims to generate the estimates of average wage rates of agricultural farm workers in the province. Among the data items gathered were the daily wage rate of farm workers by sex, the basis of payment per farm activity and the number of mandays per hectare by crop, by farm activity, by source of labor and by sex. ■

February 2019 Crops Production Survey (CrPS)

The third Level Training was conducted on 16 February 2019 in preparation for the conduct of the February 2019 Round Crops Production Survey (CrPS). Ten (10) Statistical Researchers and four (4) regular staff were trained.

For this round, CrPS used a new set of questionnaires. The enumeration period is from 18 to 26 of February 2019 involving 4 regular staff and 10 SRs for the data collection and 2 supervisors. Data entry and accomplishing the compiling systems followed after the

enumeration.

Bohol province covered 52 vegetable commodities, 28 non-food industrial crops and 66 fruit commodities to 29 municipalities of the entire province.

The CrPS is a quarterly survey that aims to generate basic production statistics of crops other than palay and corn. Data items includes volume of production, area planted and harvested and number of bearing trees, hills and vines. ■

2nd Level Operational Training on Fisheries

The 2nd Level Training on Quarterly Fisheries Survey (QFS) was conducted on March 7-8, 2019 at the Regional Statistical Services 7 (RSSO7). There were thirteen (13) participants who attended: two personnel from PSA Bohol in the persons of CSS Jessamyn Anne C. Alcazaren and SA Nicefora L. Marimon and other PSA personnel from RSSO7 and from the provinces of Cebu, Siquijor and Negros Oriental.

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) through the Fisheries Statistics Division (FSD) under the Economic Sector Statistics (ESSS) is responsible for the conduct of periodic surveys related to fisheries. The fisheries sector is composed of three (3) subsectors, namely; commercial, municipal fisheries and aquaculture. There are four (4) quarterly surveys that generate volume and value of production by species at the national, regional and provincial level. The data sets are also used for policy making and program implementation on fisheries.

Discussions were tackled on the survey methodology, field operations, survey forms, data review and validation, preparation of narrative reports and dissemination. Meanwhile, by 3rd quarter of 2019, new survey forms will be used by PSA nationwide.

The 2-day training was facilitated by SA Juliet D. Lumboan from RSSO7

from PSA Cebu who also attended the 1st Level Training (Taskforce) in Manila. It was a very informative training especially to those who were first timers in fisheries activities.

One of the issues tackled was the change of the submission of the Data Generation (Data Gen) Worksheets from the first week of the month after the reference quarter (April, July, October and December) to one week backward, that is fourth week of 3rd month of the reference quarter. It was agreed by participants of the four provincial provinces to stick to original schedule since focal persons cannot finished the work on the specified date.

Engr. Ariel E. Florendo, the Regional Director of RSSO 7 and SOCD-Chief Engr. Leopoldo P. Alfanta Jr. gave their heartfelt messages and encouraged the participants to come up with innovations during the training. Some of the innovations were to familiarize with fish species thru pictures and come up with form on the supervision of Statistical Researchers (SRs). ■



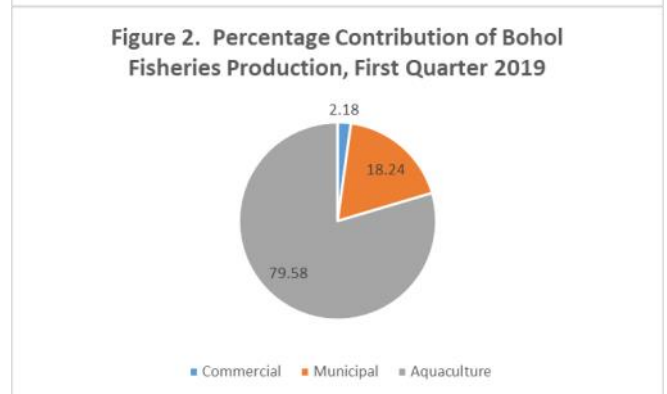
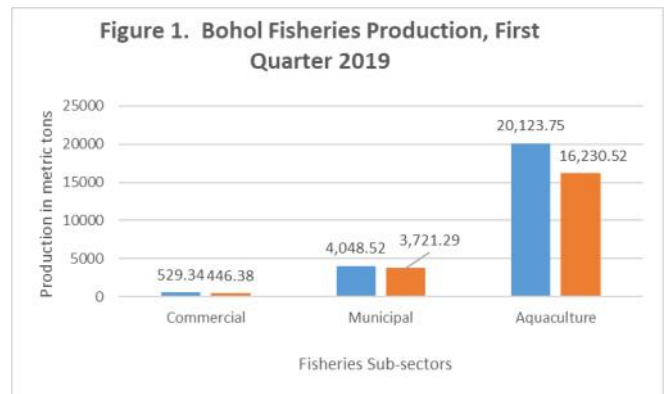

Bohol Fisheries Production in the 1st Quarter of 2019

The total Fisheries production for the province of Bohol registered a shortfall of 17.21 percent from 24,701.61 metric tons in the first quarter in 2018 to a record of 20,375.11 metric tons in the same quarter of 2019. Across Fisheries subsectors covered by Quarterly Fisheries Surveys (QFS), Aquaculture Fisheries recorded the biggest decline in terms of volume with 3,893 metric tons followed by the Commercial and Municipal Fisheries with 83 and 327 metric tons, respectively. 2019 Geotagging of Building Structures

Another round of the Geotagging of Building Structures began this March. The 2019 round is the last batch of the said mapping activity as this is in preparation for the 2020 Census of Population and Housing.

The activity required a total of 41 hired statistical researchers, three Map Data Screeners and 38 Map Data Collectors, for the province of Bohol. SA Venus P. Gloria served as the provincial focal person (PFP).

On 11-15 March 2019, the third level training was held at Level 007, JA Clarin St., Tagbilaran City.

Field operation then started on 18 March 2019. The MDCs are expected to cover 778 Enumeration Areas (EAs) province-wide. This is more than twice the workload for the 2018 round.

The supervisors for the geotagging other than the PFP are SS II Emmanuel B. Galab, SS II Fidel R. Antopina Jr., and RO I Federico I. Aparri.

As of this writing, about 90% is completed for the province. It is expected that this undertaking will be done by 30 June 2019.

Next to this is the processing of the geotagged points and EA delineation. ■

Farmgate Prices of Livestock and Poultry increases in First Quarter of 2019

Farmgate prices of backyard cattle for slaughter, carabao, hogs, goat and native chicken and commercial cattle for slaughter, carabao, goat, hogs, culled layer and chicken eggs increased in the first quarter of 2019 as compared to the same quarter in 2018.

Poultry products posted highest increment in first quarter in 2019 from the same quarter of 2018. Commercial chicken layer culled increased by 20.59 percent from 61.72 pesos per kilo in first quarter of 2018 to 74.42 pesos per kilo in first quarter of 2019. Similarly, improved native chicken increased by 14.22 percent from 169.17 pesos per kilo of first quarter 2018 to 193.22 pesos per kilo of first quarter in 2019.

For livestock, backyard cattle and carabao for slaughter had the highest increase. Backyard cattle for slaughter went up by 10.09 percent from 83.61 pesos per kilo of first quarter 2018 to 92.05 pesos per kilo during the first quarter of 2019 while backyard carabao for slaughter has increased by 8.21 percent from 73.95 pesos per kilo in 2018 first quarter to 80.02 per kilo in first quarter of 2019.

Farmgate prices of selected agricultural commodities were gathered through the monthly Farm Prices Survey (FPS). For the months of January and March, 2019, three hired Statistical Researchers (SR) were involved in the data collection while in the month of February 2019, 4 SRs and 6 regular staff were involved as FPS was conducted simultaneously with the Crops Production Survey (CrPS).

Data collection was done during the last ten days of the month. Data items gathered includes the first point of sale information including the prices, trading location and volume of the commodity traded. Data taken was the latest transaction of the sample farmer during the reference month. ■
